

**NOAA WEATHER RADIO BROADCASTS**  
 The NOAA Weather Radio stations listed below provide continuous weather broadcasts. The reception range is typically 20 to 40 nautical miles from the antenna site, but can be as much as 100 nautical miles for stations at high elevations.

Savannah, GA	KEC-85	162.400 MHz
Jesup, GA	WXJ-28	162.450 MHz
Brunswick, GA	WWH-39	162.425 MHz

**RADAR REFLECTORS**  
 Radar reflectors have been placed on many floating aids to navigation. Individual radar reflector identification on these aids has been omitted from this chart.

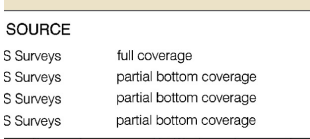
**AIDS TO NAVIGATION**

**INTRACOASTAL WATERWAY**  
 The project depth is 12 feet from Savannah to St. Simons Sound, GA, chart 11506. Controlling depths are published periodically in the U.S. Coast Guard Local Notices to Mariners.

**SURVEY DIAGRAM**  
 The limits of the most recent hydrographic survey have been evaluated for charting. Surveys have been identified by date and type of survey. Channels maintained by the U.S. Coast Guard are periodically resurveyed and are referred to in Chapter 1, United States Coast Pilot.
